### Good Behaviour!

### Medicines

If your child requires **prescribed** medicine during the school day, you must sign a permission form authorising the administration of the medicine. All medicines must be delivered and collected by an adult to the office and will be kept in the medical inspection room. Medicines can only be given out at 12.00 noon. Medicines must be in a labelled bottle that clearly states the dosage. We are sorry but we cannot administer over the counter medicines such as Calpol or Piriton. You are welcome to come to school at lunchtime to give these to your child if needed - please contact the office to arrange this in advance.

The final half term of the school year is always a very busy and exciting one with so many activities and events to look forward to. Many classes have trips or visitors planned to enhance the curriculum and several year groups are working hard rehearsing for end of year concerts. We also have lots of transition activities planned all across the school to help the children settle quickly into their new classes in September.
