Details of Pupil Premium September 2014 – August 2015

Allocation: £89,300 from April 2014- April 2015, (The above figure includes children entitled to free school meals, looked after children and 'ever 6' group)

Details of planned expenditure:

Small group tuition/reduction in class sizes

- Creation of additional morning class in Year 6 for Literacy and Numeracy
- Employment of additional qualified teacher (ex Headteacher) for 3 days per week supporting individuals and small groups in KS2 basic skills in KS2
- Employment of an experienced additional Teaching Support Assistant for 4 mornings a week in Year R and targeting specific groups and individuals
- Small group and one to one tuition in Spring/Summer terms for targeted groups in Y6 and Y2

Early Years Intervention

- Employment of additional member of staff in Nursery

One to one tuition

- One to one tuition for Year 5 pupils one morning per week
- One to one and small group tuition for Year 2 pupils two mornings per week

Oral language intervention

- Additional intervention programmes in English including Speaking and Listening groups across the school whole year

Digital technologies

- New Lexia upgrade

- School Improvement initiative focusing on feedback
- Support for residential activities and enrichment

Feedback

- Staff development on providing effective feedback to learners through AfL strategies, marking and self and peer assessment

Metacognition

- Additional enrichment events linked to topics, which enthuse and motivate learners to support accelerated progress in writing
- Use of P4C and BLP strategies across the school
- Information and guidance to parents on how to support their children's learning at home through parent information evenings and Family Learning sessions

Social and emotional support

- HOPE and Positive Play support is available if required
- Additional support in Year 3 for transition

Collaborative learning

- CPD for staff to promote more extensive use of collaborative learning opportunities for all pupils
